## **PanAir Flight Training Scholarship**



This award is designed to financially assist a current WAI Australian Chapter member with fixed wing flight training costs associated with gaining any level of flying proficiency from RPL/PPL through to the CPL by providing \$2000 dollar for dollar flying training. The flight training will be conducted by PanAir Flight Training in Bathurst, NSW.

All applications must be accompanied by a short essay 500 – 1000 words **maximum**. The descriptive essay should address the following:

- Your aviation history and goals;
- What you have done for yourself to achieve your goals;
- Where you see yourself in five years;
- How the scholarship will help you achieve your objective.

Applications open 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2021. **There are two scholarships available.**

Applications are to be submitted using the online application form at <https://waiaustralia.org/ninja-forms/34opp> which will require the uploading of your essay in either word or pdf format.

2. The flight training will be conducted by PanAir Flight Training in Bathurst, NSW.
1. Minimum age of 15 years.

### General Terms and Conditions

1. Scholarship applicants must be current financial members of WAI Australian Chapter at the time of application, and for the entirety of receipt of scholarship.
2. Parent/Guardian consent is required for any applicant under 18 years of age.
3. Shortlisted scholarship applicants will be required to provide valid identification.
4. If application requires supporting evidence, successful scholarship applicants must provide this on request.
5. Scholarship must be used within twelve months of receiving formal notification of successful application. If challenges arise, contact the Scholarship Coordinator at [scholarships@waiaustralia.org](mailto:scholarships@waiaustralia.org).
6. Depending on volume of applications, the Scholarship Coordinator may utilise a Selection Committee for shortlisting purposes.
7. The Scholarship Coordinator is the final decision maker and their decision will stand.
8. Unless specified, scholarship cannot be used for travel or accommodation expenses. Scholarship applicants are responsible for these costs.
9. Any scholarships for specific amounts will be paid either
  - a. Directly to supplier organisation upon receipt of invoice; or
  - b. By reimbursement upon successful scholarship applicant's proof of payment.
